

Articles of Incorporation
of
Sunol Community Foundation
A California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation

ONE: The name of this corporation is Sunol Community Foundation.

TWO: This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for public, charitable and educational purposes. The specific purpose for which this corporation is organized is to initiate, promote and sponsor plans and activities, to implement policies, and to receive and distribute contributions and donations to advance the, charitable, cultural and educational interests of the residents of the community of Sunol, California and the surrounding area.

THREE: The name and address in the State of California of this corporation's initial agent for service of process is Neil Davies, 2824 Kilcare Rd., Sunol, California 94586.

FOUR:(a) This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provisions of any future United States internal revenue law.

(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (1) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code or (2) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code.

(c) No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation except as provided in Section 501(h) of the Internal Revenue Code, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.

FIVE: (a) The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to public, charitable and educational purposes and no part of the net income or assets of the organization shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person.

(b) On the dissolution or winding up of the corporation, its assets remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of this corporation, shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for public, charitable and educational purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

SIX: The number and qualification of members of the corporation and the different classes of membership, if any, the voting, and other rights and privileges of members and their liabilities for dues and assessments and the method of collection therefore shall be as set forth in the Bylaws. The number of directors may be fixed or changed from time to time by amendment of the Bylaws of the corporation.
